

Private Club Bar

“**Private Club Bar**” means an applicant or licensee that has a primary function for the use of the licensed premises as a bar for the sale and consumption of alcoholic liquors and nonintoxicating beer or nonintoxicating craft beer when licensed for such sales, while providing a limited food menu for members and guests, and meeting the criteria set forth in this subsection which:

- Operates a bar with a kitchen, including at least:
 - A two-burner hot plate, air fryer, or microwave oven;
 - A sink with hot and cold running water;
 - A 17 cubic foot refrigerator or freezer, or some combination of a refrigerator and freezer, which is not used for alcohol cold storage;
 - Kitchen utensils and other food consumption apparatus, as determined by the commissioner; and
 - Food fit for human consumption, available to be served during all hours of operation.
- Maintains food inventory capable of being prepared in the private club bar’s kitchen. Food inventory for a private club bar shall include television dinners, bags of chips or similar products, microwavable food or meals, frozen meals, prepackaged foods, or canned prepared foods;
- Uses an age verification system approved by the commissioner for the purpose of verifying that persons under the age of 18 who are in the private club bar are accompanied by a parent or legal guardian, and if a person under 18 years of age is not accompanied by a parent or legal guardian that person may not be admitted as a guest; and
- 100+ members;
- Meets and is subject to all other private club requirements.
- May apply, and if in good standing, receive a permit for bottle sales for on-premises consumption only - \$1000.
- May apply, and if in good standing, receive a permit for pre-mixing of drinks for on-premises consumption only - \$0.
- May not sell craft cocktail growlers.
- May not permit carrying wine onto a licensed premises, or the uncorking of said wine.
- May not apply for a private caterer.
